The building is oriented to take advantage of daylighting. In addition, shared use spaces, including flexible/multi-use open areas, are located in the central area of the school to maximize use of space. ARC and the design team received an Honorable Mention from the Colorado Renewable Energy Society for their use of Renewable Energy on this project.
